Combining the creative might of game development studios, the expertise of education providers and the guidance of careers education, the GameChangers pledge is committed to developing new learning pathways, partnerships, funding opportunities and ways of working across the region.

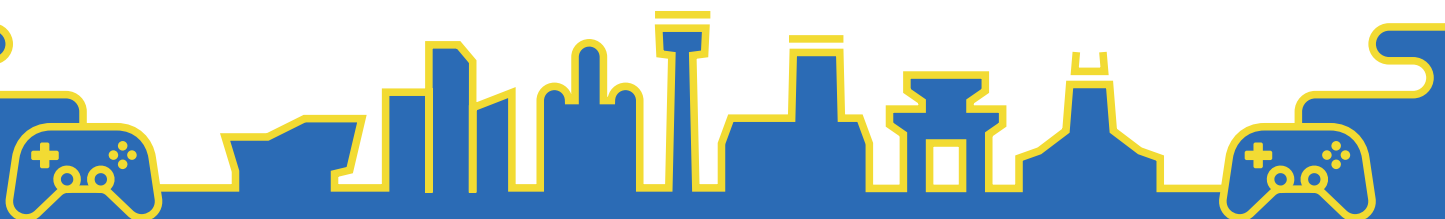
Leading games studios including Avalanche Studios Group, D3T, Firesprite, Lucid Games, Ripstone, Scenegrath Studios, Skyhook Games, Universally Speaking and Wushu Studios have already signed a pledge committing to working together to develop local games talent. These studios have been bolstered by educational and charity institutions such as the NextGen Skills Academy and the LFC Foundation.
